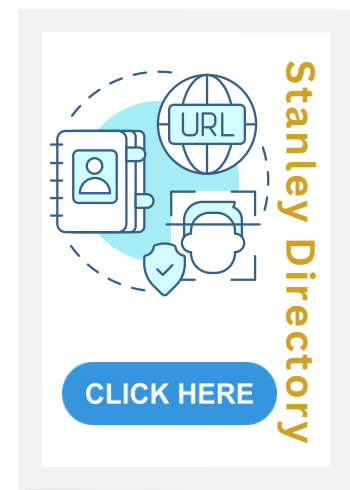

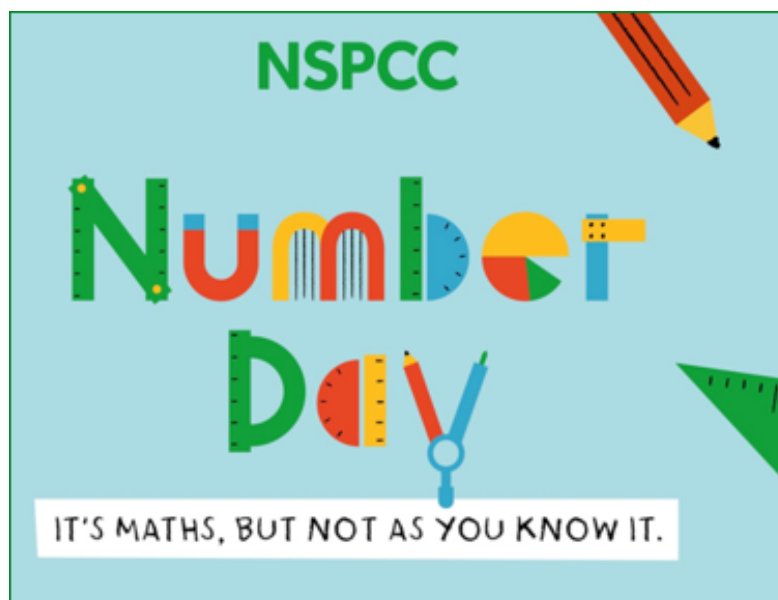
Throughout each day this week, students came during their PE lessons and breaks and lunchtimes for 'pedal and pull' to complete the challenge.

We travelled 250 miles on day 1, 384 miles on day 2, 359 miles on day 3, 366 miles on day 4 and 389 miles on day 5 which totals 1748 miles overall.

A huge thank you to the PE department and their team for their outstanding efforts in putting this together. Special thanks also to all of the students and staff who took part and for their tremendous efforts.
