We were delighted to welcome representatives from Sefton Council to Stanley High to run a lunchtime session for our students.


Students had the opportunity to share their thoughts and opinions on upcoming strategies and also to highlight any road safety issues and improvements they would like to see in their local community.

Yesterday was an exciting day as we celebrated World Book Day and all things reading! This year, we had a range of different activities in both form time and lessons including 3 different competitions.

The day started with our World Book Day Quiz in form time - where there were lots of rounds linked to a huge range of books and the 'Guess the Book' round proved to be very popular across all year groups. During lessons, students had a short story shared with them at the start of every session. By the end of the day, all students had heard the full story; 'Charles' by Shirley Jackson. Share a Story was a great success for the third year running.

Year 7 had the opportunity to participate in the National Literacy Trust's Great Footy and Booky quiz during their English and Maths lessons - they were able to join in with questions on both topics with special videos from many well-known footballers!

This year, we had 3 competitions for students to take part in: Create a Character, Character Book Hunt and Which Book Am I? Create a character was offered to all our Year 7 and 8 students and allowed them to choose their favourite book character and create a representation of them in items they had at home. It was fantastic to see the steady stream of our students bringing a huge range of book characters created in many different ways, including clay, drawing and even cake. The character book hunt has been going on all week and students have been looking all over school for 20 famous characters from a wide range of books that are in classrooms and offices.

Students from all year groups have been working hard and getting their steps in to find all 30 - it has been great to see so many of the older students also taking part. To all our parents and carers,

We are writing to introduce ourselves as we are the social worker and Early Help worker, for the Team Around The School. Our names are Sarah (Early help worker) and Katie (social worker), and we will be holding some drop in sessions throughout March, in school, so you can come and meet us if you want to.

Team around the school is being introduced to all schools across Southport, following a successful pilot programme. TAS is a multi-agency approach to supporting families at the earliest opportunity in a way that empowers families, builds on their strengths and develops resilience.

The team is made up of a number of professionals who will come together to support you - these are made up of an Early Help Worker, Social Worker, School Nurse, Inclusion consultant and a Mental Health Support worker. The team working collaboratively with the school also have access to a huge number of colleagues from supporting teams who they can contact for varied support.

The Team Around the School (TAS) can support with concerns on:

- Family routines, child development, attendance, sleep
- Health concerns
- Speech and language
- Money worries
- Emotional health and wellbeing
- Managing behaviour and setting boundaries
- Drug or alcohol misuse
- Parenting
