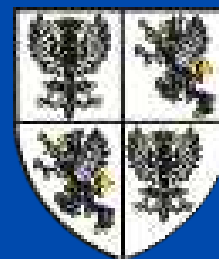

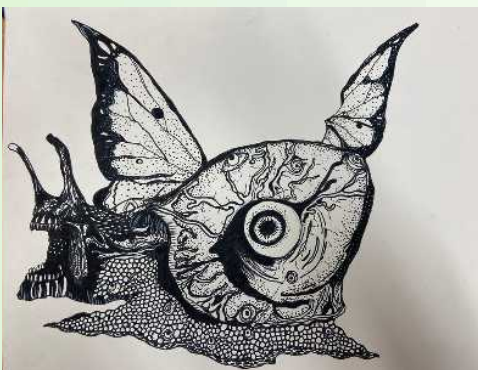
Our choir delivered beautiful renditions of “Last Christmas,” “Fairytale of New York,” and “Silent Night,” filling the venue with festive cheer.

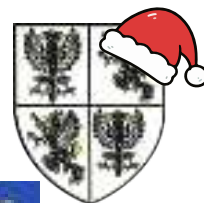

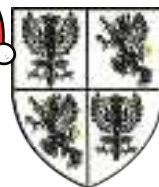
## Inter Form Christmas Door Competition

In March 2025, one of our own, Harish, will be diagnosed with Stage 4 Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma. He began the fight of his life at Alder Hey Children's Hospital, under the care of their renowned Oncology Department, where he and 120 children were just under a treatment for cancer.

After months of aggressive chemotherapy, Harish is now in remission - back at school, back in the gym and back swimming.

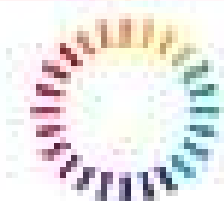
