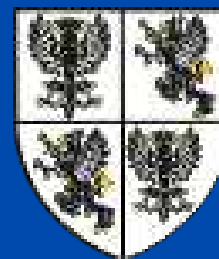

30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year



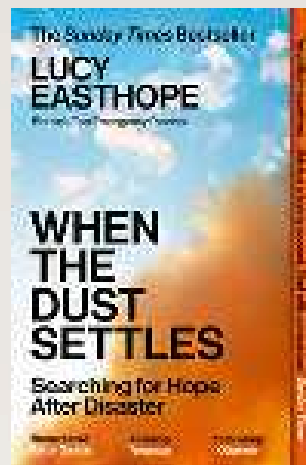
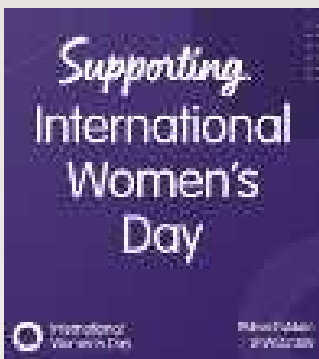
International Women's Day 2026
