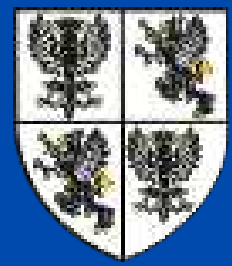

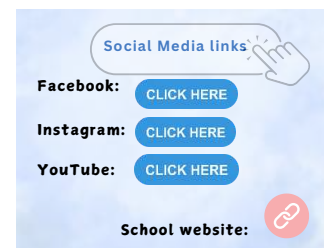

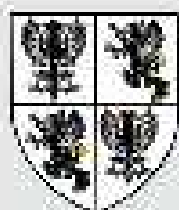
## Year 6 Families - save the date

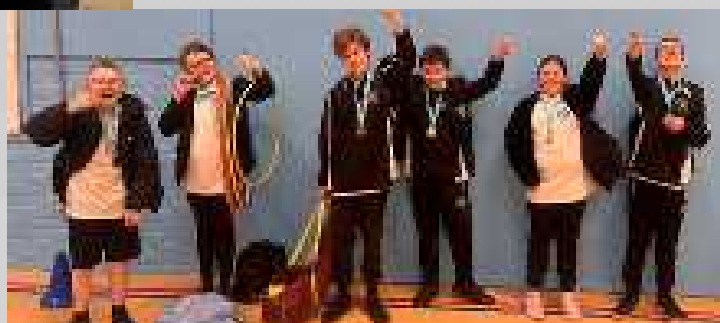
