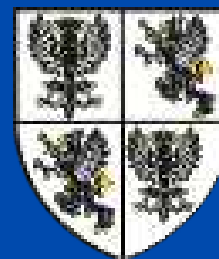

The programme is completely free to attend for any parents and carers of autistic children and young people - this version of the programme specifically targets the experiences of autistic young people of secondary school age.

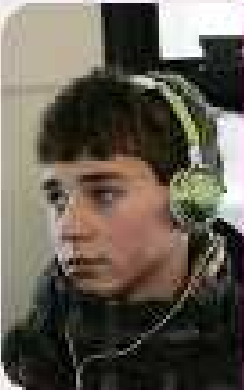

The Autism Learning Programme has been designed to support and empower parents and carers to understand how autism is experienced by young people aged 11-18 and to provide guidance and strategies to enable you to meet your own young person's individual needs as they navigate high school, puberty and increased social expectations.

Advanced Solutions Community Network is commissioned to deliver this programme for parents and carers in Sefton and Liverpool whose young person has received a diagnosis of autism, but subject to availability, places will also be offered to those who are waiting for a diagnosis.

Safeguarding means **keeping you safe** and acting to look after you if you are ever at risk. Safeguarding is the **most important job** we do in a school.

If you are concerned about your **own safety or well being**, or the **safety and well being of someone else in school**, it is really important that you talk to any member of staff. That member of staff will explain your concerns confidentially to a member of the safeguarding team. You can also speak directly to the safeguarding team.

Hydration

As we experience extremely warm weather, please remind your child(ren) to bring a re-usable drink bottle into school with them.

We do have water fountains in each zone where they can re-fill them, should they need to.

Please be reminded that if your child has a medical appointment, we require some form of proof to be able to authorise them. We also ask that if the appointment cannot be made after school, then the child attends school before and after their appointment. Students need to be present for 9am to get their morning mark and 1pm for their afternoon mark.

We also ask that you call school with the reason should your child be absent from school. No contact could become a safeguarding concern.
