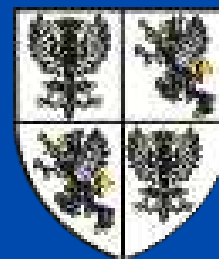

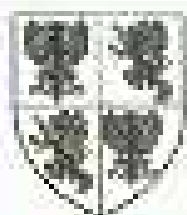

As we begin the new academic year, we would like to remind all families about the importance of allergy awareness and keeping our school a safe environment for every child.

From September 2026, new statutory allergy-safety guidance, commonly referred to as Benedict's Law, strengthens the expectations on schools in England to protect children and young people living with allergies. This includes having clear allergy procedures, ensuring staff are appropriately trained, and being prepared to respond to allergic emergencies.

As part of our commitment to allergy safety, our school operates a nut-free policy. We therefore ask that parents and carers do not send children into school with nuts or products containing nuts, including snacks, packed lunches, cakes, sweets or other food items.

This is particularly important because even small amounts of an allergen can cause a serious, potentially life threatening reaction in someone with a severe allergy. We appreciate that it can be difficult to identify all ingredients, so please check food labels carefully before sending food into school.

We also ask that children do not share food with other students as this can create an additional risk for children with allergies.

How you can help.

Please:

- Check the ingredients of all food brought into school.
- Do not send nuts or nut-containing products into school.
- Remind your child not to share food with others.
- Inform the school immediately if your child develops a new allergy or their existing allergy changes.
- Ensure that any prescribed adrenaline auto-injectors and allergy action plans provided to school are in date and up to date.

We understand that managing allergies is a shared responsibility. By working together, we can help ensure that children with allergies can learn, play and participate in school life as safely and confidently as possible. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation.

Pharmacy First

This service enables children and adults to get quick access to healthcare advice by walking in to their local pharmacy to access the service (some pharmacies also offer the service remotely as a video consultation). A consultation with a pharmacist in a private consultation room will then be offered. This service takes away the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment and may help ensure children and staff get well and back to school as quickly as possible, potentially positively impacting attendance rates.
